BURNETT COUNTY

The information presented here represents data specific to Burnett County, Wisconsin from 2001-2006, and is meant to complement the report, *The Burden of Suicide in Wisconsin*. Please refer to this report for technical notes and suicide prevention strategies. For counties with fewer than 20 suicides each year, data are aggregated for 2001-2006 and findings are presented in bullets rather than tables.

KEY FINDINGS

◆The suicide rate in Burnett County for all years was higher than the state rate for all years (16.3⁺ versus 11.8).

- ◆Suicide represented a total of 1,541 years of potential life lost, at a rate of 472.1 for 2001-2006. This was more than the state rate (394.1 YPLL) for the same time period.
- ◆The greatest number of suicides occurred in individuals aged 55-64, while the greatest number of hospitalizations and emergency department visits occurred in younger individuals, aged 15-24.
- ♦ Firearms were the most frequently used method in Burnett County suicides (69%) followed by hanging, strangulation, or suffocation (19%).
