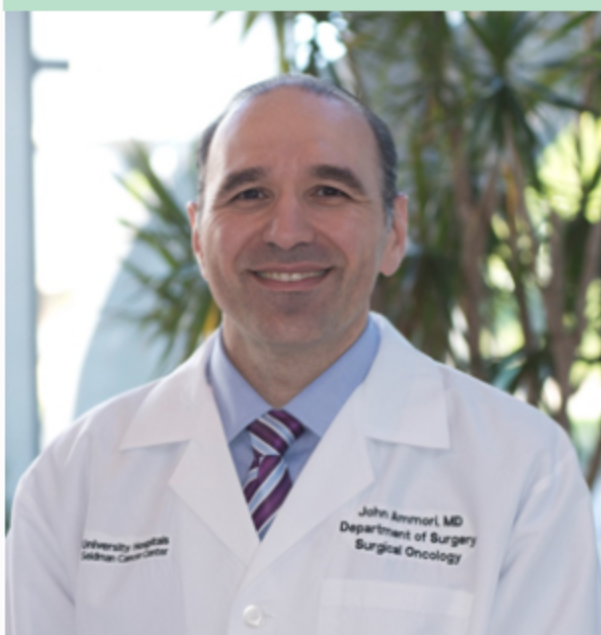

### About the Author: John Ammori, MD



Dr. Ammori is Professor of Surgery at Case Western Reserve University specializing in upper GI, liver, and pancreatic malignancies, and serves as Program Director of the General Surgery Residency at University Hospitals Cleveland Medical Center. He attended the University of Michigan for most of his training including undergraduate, medical school, general surgery residency and a research fellowship. He completed a fellowship in Complex General Surgical Oncology at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York before moving to his current position in Cleveland in 2011. Academically, his career has focused on surgical education. He has been recognized as "Teacher

of the Year" by the general surgery residency. He has served as a member of the Clinical Competency Committee since its inception in 2014, chairing the committee from 2016-2019. He was the Associate Program Director of the General Surgery Residency from 2016-2019 during which time he formalized a surgical skills curriculum for the residents and initiated an annual Residents as Teachers curriculum for the residency. He assumed the role of Program Director (PD) for the General Surgery Residency in 2019. Nationally, he has served on the Society of Surgical Oncology CME/CPD committee (2016-2018), the American College of Surgeons Committee on General Surgery Objective Structured Assessment of Technical Skills for Surgery Residents (2017-2021), the American Board of Surgery Entrustable Professional Activities Writing Group (2022-2023). He was inducted into the Case Western Reserve University Academy of Scholar Educators in 2019 and the American College of Surgeons Academy of Master Surgeon Educators in 2022.
